Chang-Min Kim, MD, is Principle Scientist of Research Institute, and Clinical staff of Center for Liver Cancer, National Cancer Center, Korea. Dr. Kim graduated MD from Seoul National University, College of Medicine and did residency (Internal Medicine) training at Seoul National University Hospital from 1979-1983. He has a research fellowship in NCI/NIH and Jerome H. Holland laboratory, USA from 1989-1990.

He has worked as Chief of Department of Gastroenterology and Head of Laboratory of Molecular Oncology at Korea Cancer Center Hospital from 1986-2000. He moved to National Cancer Center, Korea as founding member in 2000. He was Director of Research Institute and Head of Center for Liver Cancer. He also served as Director of National Cancer Control Planning Board of Korea from 2000-2008.

He is hepatologist who see the patients with hepatocellular carcinoma. His research interests are molecular carcinogenesis of hepatocellular carcinoma and National Cancer Control Project including hepatocellular carcinoma. He has published >170 scientific papers and >10 book chapters. He has won several awards including the Hans Popper Award from APASL in 1991, and National Medal of Republic of Korea for his contribution on national R&D project and health policy in 2008. He is a past-president of the Korean Association for the Study of the Liver and the Korean Liver Cancer Study Group. He is currently a Member of the Executive Council of the Asian Pacific Association for the Study of the Liver.
