Jose D. Sollano, Jr., is Professor of Medicine at the University of Santo Tomas.

His major interests include chronic hepatitis B, hepatocellular carcinoma, portal hypertension, therapeutic endoscopy of the biliopancreatic system, GERD and peptic ulcer disease, and of course, inflammatory bowel disease. He received the Most Outstanding Researcher Award of the Philippine College of Physicians in 2003 and a consistent Gold/Silver Awardee for Research of the University of Santo Tomas since 2001. In 2012, he is also a recipient of the Thomas Award for Research of the UST Medical Alumni Association. His research activities have earned him the distinction of being the first Filipino clinical researcher who has successfully passed the rigorous audit of the US Food and Drug Administration (US FDA) in 2005.

He is a key opinion leader in Asia and has been Faculty and/or Convenor of several Asian-Pacific Consensus Guidelines, including those on H. pylori and Dyspepsia (1999), GI Toxicity of NSAIDs (2000), Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (2003 & 2006 & the planned 2014 revision), Inflammatory Bowel Diseases (2004 & 2012), Chronic Hepatitis B (2005, 2009, 2012 and 2014), Chronic Hepatitis C (2000 & 2006 & 2013), Hepatic Fibrosis (2014) and NonAlcoholic Fatty Liver Disease (2007). He has also been Faculty of many international Therapeutic Endoscopy Live Demo Workshops all over the world. He has written 5 book chapters, has published several original scientific works and serves as a reviewer and/or member of the Editorial Board of several international journals in Gastroenterology, Endoscopy and Hepatology.

Dr. Jose D. Sollano was President of the Asia Pacific Association for the Study of the Liver (APASL) in 2004-2006 – the only Filipino hepatologist to have held the highest position of this imminent Asian specialty organization. He is a Past President of the Philippine Society of Gastroenterology, Philippine Society of Digestive Endoscopy, as well as, the Philippine College of Physicians. He is Member of the 2011-2012 Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD) Task Force of the World Gastroenterology Organization (WGO).
