

Dr. Lewis R. Roberts is the Peter and Frances Georgeson Professor in Gastroenterology Cancer Research at the Mayo Clinic, where he Directs the Hepatobiliary Neoplasia Clinic, is Associate Director of Pre-Doctoral Programs in the Center for Clinical and Translational Sciences, and Director for Research at Mayo Clinic School of Medicine. He earned his medical degree from the University of Ghana Medical School, a PhD in Physiology and Biophysics from The University of Iowa, and completed postgraduate training in Internal Medicine, Gastroenterology and Hepatology, and Cancer Genetics at Mayo Clinic.

Dr. Roberts clinical practice is focused on liver and bile duct cancers. His research includes studies of the mechanisms of liver and biliary carcinogenesis; biomarkers to improve the diagnosis of liver, bile duct and pancreas cancers; and prevention, diagnosis and treatment of hepatitis and liver cancer in Africa as well as in immigrant African and Asian communities in the USA. His research has been funded by NIH, The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the AGA Foundation, and The Cholangiocarcinoma Foundation. He has authored over 200 publications.

Dr. Roberts currently serves as Deputy Editor of *Hepatology* and is on the Editorial Boards of *Liver Cancer* and *Hepatic Oncology*. He also serves as President of Africa Partners Medical, a non-profit organization focused on improving health in Africa through education, practical skills training, and provision of medical equipment.
