Dr. Satapathy graduated from Veer Surendra Sai Medical College of Sambalpur University, India. He completed his Residency in Internal Medicine training at the same college, and then 2 year of Hepatology training at the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research at Chandigarh, India. He then moved to New Delhi where he joined G.B. Pant Hospital as a Gastroenterology Fellow under the mentorship Professor Shiv Sarin. After completion of his training he moved to the United States in 2004. He re-trained in Internal Medicine (New York Medical College), Gastroenterology (North Shore LIJ Hospital, New York), and went on to complete a Transplant Hepatology Fellowship at the Mount Sinai Medical Center at New York. He is currently board certified in Internal Medicine, Gastroenterology, and Transplant Hepatology by the American Board of Internal Medicine. Dr. Satapathy joined the Methodist University Hospital Transplant Institute, University of Tennessee Health Sciences Center, Memphis, Tennessee in 2011 as a Transplant Hepatologist, where he currently serves at Associate Professor rank. He is also a skilled advanced therapeutic endoscopist particularly in ERCP and EUS.

He spearheaded the clinical research program at the Methodist University Hospital Transplant Institute. Dr. Satapathy's research focuses on post-transplant outcomes, particularly in patients with NASH, and hepatitis C. He has published more than 60 papers. His main contributions include his research in pentoxifylline in NASH, and the use of Galantamine in metabolic syndrome. Based on the Google citation index, his work has been cited more than 1200 times so far in numerous major scientific journals. Dr. Satapathy has received many awards throughout his career including Auxiliary Award for best scientific paper by the American College of Gastroenterology at the ACG 2009 Annual Scientific Meeting, and Astra-Zenica/Senior Fellow Award for best scientific paper by the American College of Gastroenterology at the ACG 2011 Annual Scientific Meeting. He is currently a Fellow American Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (FASGE), and Fellow of American College of Gastroenterology (FACG). Dr. Satapathy served as an Academic Editor of Medicine since 2014, and reviewer of several international peer reviewed journals including Hepatology, Gastroenterology, Transplantation and Liver Transplantation. He served as Member National Affairs committee, American College of Gastroenterology (2016-2017), and member International Affairs committee, American College of Gastroenterology (2012-2015). Dr. Satapathy is the founding member of the Heritage International Liver Foundation, a non-profit organization which aims to bridge the gap between providers and patients.
