



Sophie Lotersztajn obtained her PhD in biochemistry from Paris University and is now Director of Research at the Institut National de la Santé et de la Recherche Médicale (INSERM). She is the chairman of the Hepato-Gastroenterology Department of the Center for Research in Inflammation in Paris, where she also heads a group devoted to the study of inflammation and fibrosis in the liver. She has described the role of the endocannabinoid system in liver repair and inflammation, and her current interest is to investigate how immune cells (macrophages and lymphocytes) control chronic liver disease progression. She has organized and has been invited to a large number of international meetings such as Cold Spring Harbor, FASEB, EASL, AASLD, Experimental Biology, and has published papers in high ranked journals (Nature Medicine, PNAS, Annual review of Pharmacology, Gastroenterology, Hepatology etc...). She has or currently chairs many French and international committees and scientific boards (INSERM, Fondation pour la Recherche Médicale, European Community). She currently serves as an Associate Editor for Journal of Hepatology and American Journal of Physiology-Cell Physiology.
